Winter Home Maintenance Keeping your home clean and cosy over winter

Take Care with Heating

Take care not to plug in too many appliances at once, check the quality and safety of extension leads and power boards regularly, and use devices with built-in safety switches or circuit breakers where possible. Make sure there is also adequate ventilation around power points and power boards. Before going to bed or leaving the house, always remember to turn off heaters and blow out candles. Finally, keep clothing, toys, and curtains away from heaters or naked flames at all times.
